2019 New Mexico Grande Slam Tees Off September 20

Santa Ana Pueblo, NM-The Notah Begay III Foundation will hold its annual New Mexico Grande Slam on Friday, Sept. 20 at Twin Warriors Golf Club. The golf tournament raises money for organizations and non-profits that work on improving the lives of children.

Since 2016, the event has raised over \$600,000 for the NB3 Foundation and a dozen other organizations focused on eliminating disparities, creating opportunities and providing hope for children. In addition to the NB3 Foundation, this year's proceeds will benefit Big Brothers, Big Sisters of Central New Mexico, Dar a Luz Birth & Health Center and the Chinle High School Basketball team.

"The New Mexico Grande Slam is a great example of the difference we can make when individuals, corporations and tribal nations work together on a common goal. In this case, raising money for organizations doing amazing work to improve the lives our children," Notah Begay III said. "I'm so proud of the impact it is having in our communities, and I look forward to working with this year's partner organizations."

200 golfers from New Mexico and across the nation are registered to play in tournament. A Shot-gun start is scheduled for 9:00 am, with the awards ceremony taking place at 2:00 pm.
